\*The entire park will be getting a slurry seal on all the asphalt in the park. It will look like new roads! There may be some detours and the campgrounds will be on first-come-first-serve until mid May.

\*In addition, we will be re-paving the west side of the marina parking lot.

\*A full size decontamination station for the prevention of Aquatic Invasive Species will also be installed this summer. This will help decontaminate vessels more quickly and thoroughly. However, the best method is still to clean, drain, and dry for the recommended time periods.

3. Don't drink and boat





## Safety Equipment Checklist

After dusting off your boat from a long winter, make sure you have all the safety equipment you need and are required to have on board. It's also a great idea to get a FREE Vessel Safety Inspection by a Ranger or US Coast Guard Auxiliary member. Your insurance rates might be lowered, check with your agent.

- (a) Required for all registered vessels. Registration is required for all motorized and sailing vessels.
- (b) Required for all registered vessels except U.S. Coast Guard documented vessels.
- (c) Not required for outboard motorboats of open construction; however they are recommended for all motorboats.
- (d) Vessels 26 ft to 40 ft must carry two B-I or one B-II fire extinguisher(s).
- (e) Vessels 40 ft and longer must carry three B-I or one B-I and one B-II fire extinguisher(s).
- (f) Vessels 40 ft and longer must carry a bell in addition to a horn or whistle.
- (g) Required for inboard gasoline engines equipped with a carburetor.
- (h) Vessels exempt from this requirement include: sailboats, canoes, kayaks, inflatable vessels, and vessels manufactured prior to 1973.

## Aquatic Invasive Species News

Lake Powell and now Deer Creek Reservoir are the most recent victims of this invasion. **Starting immediately, those boating on Deer Creek Reservoir must decontaminate their boat before leaving the state park. DNA tests at two laboratories indicate microscopic juvenile quagga mussels—called veligers—were found in a water sample taken at the reservoir.** Thousands of adult Quagga mussels have been found from Glenn Canyon Dam to Bullfrog Bay, some 95 miles away. These creatures first came to the states in the 1980's and have been making their way west. State officials have estimated that an infestation in Utah could cost more than \$15 million annually if our water system pipes become coated with mussels. These little creatures reproduce by the millions, suck precious nutrients out of the water harming fisheries, leave their sharp shells on beaches, clog infrastructure and recreational equipment.

### Some scary facts:

**What if you turned on your faucet, and there was no water!**



- One adult female can produce up to a million eggs each year.
- Newly hatched mussels (called veligers) are microscopic. They easily latch onto boats and other items in the water.
- Adult mussels can live for about 30 days in water that collects on boats and equipment.

### What can we do?

• **The best method is to CLEAN, DRAIN, and DRY.** Remove all mud, plants and animals, and then thoroughly wash every part of your boat, trailer, and equipment. Before you leave the lake, eliminate all water from your boat, including its wells, ballasts and engine-cooling water. Allow time for your boat to completely dry before you launch in other waters. This amount of time will vary from days to weeks, depending on the humidity and temperature. In the summer, your dry time should be at least 7 days. **Inspect everything: if it gets wet, it could harbor mussels.**

• **Be observant and spread the word!** Share your knowledge of this invasion with others. Watch for boats with plants or encrusted motors and report them immediately to authorities.

• **Quagga Technicians are available for you.** Each water body will have techs working to talk to boat owners and determine if they have been in infested waters. They can provide a professional decontamination, but keep in mind, self-decontamination is best. It can be very difficult to get to all parts of a boat and kill any possible mussels. Completely drying out your boat is best. Be sure to fill out the Mussel Free Certification form each time you launch. If you don't travel too much, an annual form is available on-line.

**Gas** NOTICE OF PIPELINE CONSTRUCTION

Questar Gas is constructing two sections of new high-pressure underground natural gas pipeline in Wasatch County. These projects are necessary to meet growing customer demand for natural gas in the area, will improve the overall integrity of Questar Gas's existing system and will allow the company to continue providing safe, reliable service.

Questar Gas will install 8.5 miles of 12-inch-diameter steel pipe along State Road 32 from Victory Ranch near Francis to U.S. Highway 40. This section of pipe is scheduled to be completed and placed into service by November 2015. During construction between now and November, motorists on SR32 can expect temporary lane restrictions and flagger-controlled one-way traffic in work zones. Work on this section may be subject to temporary suspension to protect wildlife in the area, including nesting raptors and spawning trout. Fisherman access to the Provo River on this road may be impacted due to pipeline construction through the river in the fall.
