# Factor 2. Partnerships/Volunteer Support:

Is this a phased project?

• Does project demonstrate coordinated partnerships among various groups (federal agency, state agency, local government, non-profit group, community volunteer group, etc.)?

For trail construction, does project, at a minimum, meet Utah State Parks trail design standards?

- Has the applicant and/or partner held open house(s) or public meeting(s) about project?
- Have letters of support been submitted?

### Factor 3. Budget/Cost:

- Is there sufficient budget detail?
- Is the source of all funding shown and does it total the requested dollar amount?
- Has entity requested maximum amount allowable (50%)? Note: Higher rating the more the entity brings.
- Do all items listed qualify for funding under this program? (Items not funded include sidewalks, curb/gutter, landscaping, picnic facilities, etc.)
- Are contingencies reasonable (e.g., 10% or less)?
- Does overall cost seem reasonable? For example, non-paved or natural trail will be much less than paved trail; bridges will add to cost, boardwalk will add to cost, etc.

## Factor 4. Schedule:

- Does schedule appear feasible?
- Does schedule begin no sooner than October of year of grant application?
- Is work completed within two years of October of year of grant application?

### Factor 5. Other Factors:

- Are there photos demonstrating before/after, existing portion(s) of project, etc.?
- Is there a map providing sufficient detail (not too much/ not too little) for location and/or route?
