"Alien" means any person who is not a citizen or *national* of the United States. (8 U.S.C. 1101).

"National of the United States" means (1) a citizen of the United States, or (2) a person who is not a citizen of the United States but owes permanent allegiance to the United States. (8 U.S.C. 1101).

"Qualified alien" as defined in 8 U.S.C. § 1641, means an alien who, at the time of application for a disability accommodation, request for proposal contract, grant, or commercial wildlife document:

- (1) is lawfully admitted for permanent residence under the Immigration and Nationality Act in 8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.;
- (2) has been granted asylum under section 208 of 8 U.S.C. 1158;
- (3) is a refugee who is admitted to the United States under section 207 of 8 U.S.C. 1157;
- (4) has been paroled into the United States under 8 U.S.C. 1182(d)(5) for a period of at least one (1) year;
- (5) being deported but the deportation is withheld under section 243(h) of 8 U.S.C. 1253;
- (6) is granted conditional entry pursuant to section 203(a)(7) of 8 U.S.C. 1153(a)(7) as in effect prior to April 1, 1980; or
- (7) is a Cuban and Haitian entrant, as defined in section 501(e) of the Refugee Education Assistance Act of 1980:

No person shall operate a vessel engaged in carrying passengers for hire on sole state waters unless that person has in his possession a valid and appropriately endorsed license or permit. R651-206-3 (1). When carrying passengers for hire on a motorboat on the waters of Bear Lake, Flaming Gorge and Lake Powell, the operator must have a valid an appropriately endorsed U.S. Coast Guard Master's License. R651-206-3(1)(a)

CAPTAIN/GUIDE/INSTRUCTOR LICENSE AND BOAT CREW PERMIT INFORMATION

All licensing/permitting and testing will be done by appointment only. See website for testing center locations or information on taking the test at our main headquarters.

CAPTAIN/GUIDE/INSTRUCTOR DEFINITIONS

Lake and Reservoir Captain (LRC): To qualify for an LCG the applicant must be at least 18 years of age, be current in the required first aid and CPR certification, successfully complete a written examination, successfully complete a NASBLA approved boating safety course, pay a \$50 fee (see study guide for a complete fee schedule) and have a minimum of at least 80 hours of actual vessel operation experience. (40 hours on actual vessel specific to lake or reservoir on which they will be carrying passengers for hire)

<u>Lake and Reservoir Instructor (LRI):</u> To qualify for an LRI the applicant must be at least 18 years of age, be current in the required first aid and CPR certification, successfully complete a written examination, pay a \$50 fee (see study guide for complete fee schedule) and have a minimum of 40 hours of actual vessel operating experience. (At least 10 of these hours must be obtained through mentored coaching.

Tow Vessel Captain (TVC): To qualify for an TCG the applicant must be at least 18 years of age, be current in the required first aid and CPR certification, successfully complete a written examination, successfully complete a NASBLA approved boating safety course, pay a \$50 fee (see study guide for a complete fee schedule) and have a minimum of at least 80 hours of actual vessel operation experience. (40 hours on actual vessel specific to lake or reservoir on which they will be towing vessels)

Whitewater River Guide (WRG): To qualify for an WCG the applicant must be at least 18 years of age, be current in the required first aid and CPR certification, pay a \$50 fee (see study guide for a complete fee schedule), successfully complete a written examination, and have a minimum experience of nine river trips on whitewater river sections. An endorsement meets the requirements for an FRG. (One trip on similar vessel on respective river section on which they will be carrying passengers for hire)

<u>Flatwater River Guide (FRG)</u>: To qualify for an FRG the applicant must be at least 18 years of age, be current in the required first aid and CPR certification, pay a \$50 fee (see study guide for a complete fee schedule), successfully complete a written examination, and have a minimum experience of six river trips on any river section. (One trip on a similar vessel on a respective river section on which they will be carrying passengers for hire)

RETESTING: If a LRC, LRI, TVC, WRG or FRG applicant fails to pass the written examination, there is a 7-day waiting period and a \$15 retest fee per attempt.

"Whitewater River" All rivers not designated as a flatwater river area or other Division recognized whitewater rivers in other states.

"Flatwater River Areas" means all rivers or river sections defined in R651-215-10

BOAT CREW DEFINITIONS

<u>Lake and Reservoir Crew Permit (LRCP)</u>: To qualify for an LRC the applicant must be at least 18 years of age, be current in the required first aid and CPR certification, successfully complete a NASBLA approved boating safety course, pay a \$50 fee*, and have a minimum of at least 20 hours of actual vessel operation experience. (10 hours on actual vessel specific to lake or reservoir on which they will be carrying passengers for hire)

Tow Vessel Crew Permit (TVCP): To qualify for a TVC the applicant must be at least 18 years of age, be current in the required first aid and CPR certification, successfully complete a NASBLA approved boating safety course, pay a \$50 fee*, and have a minimum of at least 20 hours of actual vessel operation experience. (10 hours on actual vessel specific to lake or reservoir on which they will be towing vessels)

Whitewater River Crew Permit (WRCP) To qualify for an WRC the applicant must be at least 18 years of age, be current in the required first aid and CPR certification, pay a \$50 fee*, and have a minimum experience of three 'whitewater' rivers or river sections. A WRC endorsement meets the requirements for an ORC. (One trip on actual vessel on respective river section on which they will be carrying passengers for hire)

<u>Flatwater River Crew Permit (FRCP)</u>: To qualify for an ORC the applicant must be at least 18 years of age, be current in the required first aid and CPR certification, pay a \$50 fee*, and have a minimum experience of any three river sections. (One trip on actual vessel on respective river section on which they will be carrying passengers for hire)

- *The applicant shall pay a \$50 application fee for the original permit and first endorsement. A \$10 fee shall be charged for each additional crew permit endorsement.
- "Whitewater River" means all river sections not designated as flatwater river areas or other Division recognized rivers in other states or countries.
- "Flatwater River Areas" means all rivers or river sections defined in R651-215-10
