

## Good Information

Hiking in a slot canyon check the weather first (Goblin Valley updates the weather first posted in the windows daily).

That dry washes are results of previous floods.

Hiking a narrow canyon you are assuming a risk. Narrow canyons during stormy weather. There are changing conditions.

Know your escape routes.

If in a stream, be aware of rising water or stronger currents and sudden changes in clarity.

## Caution/Dehydration

Be aware of this arid environment where temperatures often exceed 90 degrees in summer. Access to water is generally scarce.

Summer carry at least one gallon per person per day to stay hydrated.

Signs of heat exhaustion can include: heavy sweating, fatigue, muscle cramps, tiredness, dizziness, headache, nausea/vomiting, and confusion.

Prevention can include: cool beverages, rest, cool clothing, and an air-conditioned environment.

Signs of dehydration can include: muscle cramps, dry or sticky mouth, headache, dizziness, and thirst.

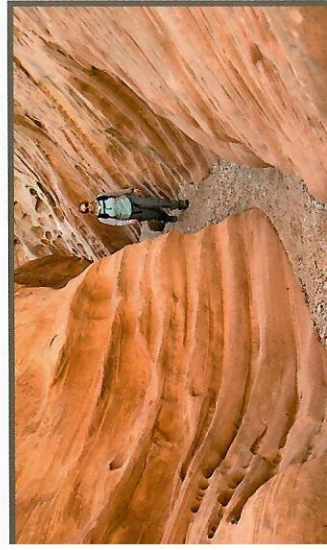

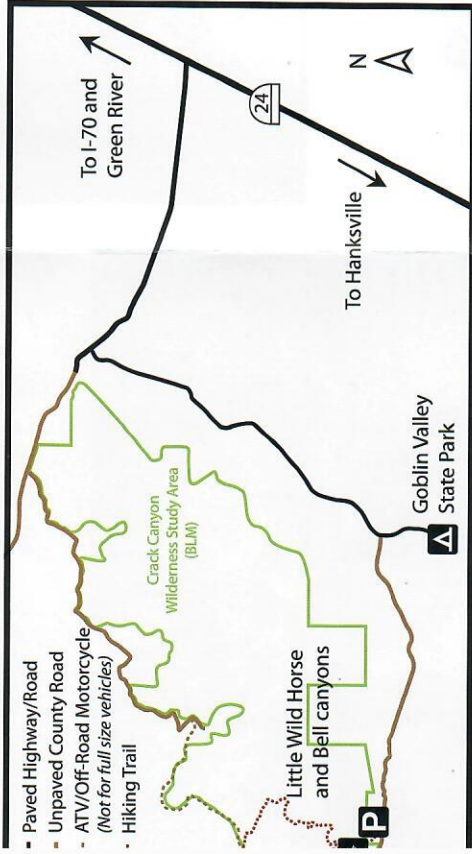

**Notes:**

the signed, improved road for Little Wild Horse just before entering Valley State Park. Drive approximately 5.4 miles to the trailhead, which will be on the right. If the parking lot is full, there are additional spots a short distance down the road.



**Wild Horse/Bell Loop:**

The trailhead — 8 mile loop (4-6 hours) can be completed by going up either Bell or Little Wild Horse Canyon. From the parking lot, follow the trail along the wash for 0.5 miles, where a small sign indicates that Little Wild Horse is on the left. When you exit the canyon, walk 1.6 miles along the Reef Road until you connect with the other canyon. Once you reach the fork, follow the wash back to the trailhead and your car.

The Wild Horse and Bell Canyon Loop is a moderately strenuous hike. It doesn't require technical canyoneering skills, hikers should be in good physical condition. Sections of this hike require basic scrambling skills and the use of both hands and feet to maneuver around obstacles.
