

Park Guidelines

Please observe the following park regulations to ensure everyone's visit is pleasant.

Pets — Pets must be leashed and under control at all times. Please clean up after your pet.

Quiet Hours — 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Please turn off generators and music.

Fires — Campfires are allowed only in designated fire rings. Do not leave fires unattended. Fire restrictions may be in effect.

Firearms — The use of firearms, traps, or other devices capable of launching a projectile that can immobilize, injure or kill a person or animal, or damage property is prohibited. Contact a park ranger for more information.

Fireworks — Explosives, fireworks, or firecrackers are prohibited unless authorized by the park manager.

Plants and Animals — All plants, animals, minerals, and other natural features in state parks are protected. It is unlawful to remove, alter or destroy them.

Campsites — Camping is allowed only in designated campsites. Campsite fees cover one vehicle and any attached recreational equipment. There is an extra fee for additional vehicles or camping equipment. Up to eight people are allowed on a campsite. A permit is required for boat camping.

Special Use Permit — A Special Use Permit is required for all special events and commercial or professional filming and photography.

Climbing— Climbing on rocks, jumping, and/or diving from rocks is hazardous. Do so at your own risk.

Glass— No glass bottles or containers on the beaches.

Please DO NOT tread on vegetation.

Parking— Park in designated areas only.

Vandalism— It is unlawful to mutilate or deface any natural or constructed feature or structure.



Your park fees provide for the care, protection, and enhancement of this park.

From I-15 take Hurricane Exit 16, then travel five miles east on State Road 9. Turn right on Sand Hollow Road and drive three miles to the park entrance.

Sand Hollow State Park



Utah State Parks

With its warm, blue waters and red sandstone landscape, Sand Hollow State Park provides recreation opportunities for nearly every visitor, from boaters and off-highway vehicle (OHV) riders to triathletes. Boat and fish on Sand Hollow Reservoir, explore and ride the dunes of Sand Mountain on an OHV, then RV or tent camp in one of the campgrounds.



History

Completed in April 2003, Sand Hollow Reservoir was created by Washington County Water Conservancy District as additional water storage for Washington County. Used as culinary water by cities and towns in southwestern Utah, Sand Hollow Reservoir serves as an important water source in this otherwise hot and arid part of Utah

Camping

Westside campground offers 50 full-hookup sites with water, sewer, electricity, barbeques, firepits, and covered picnic areas at each site. Restrooms and showers are available.

Sandpit campground offers 4 partial hookups, 2 of the partial-hookups are small group sites with water, electricity, barbeques and firepits. Sandpit also offers 5 large group sites with picnic tables and firepits, 6 small group dry sites, and 6 camping sites. Restrooms and showers are available for Sandpit campers.

Lakeview campground offers 8 full-hookup sites, and 22 partial-hookups with water, electricity, barbeques, firepits, and picnic areas at each site. Restrooms and showers are available for all Lakeview campers.

Primitive campground offers disperse camping on the east side of the lake after the Lakeview campground. Vault toilets available and lake side views. Fires are prohibited in the sand, surrounded by rocks or any other material that is not in an approved fire pit.



Obey Boating Laws and Rules

- Invasive Species: All boats must be inspected before launching.
- Wakeless speed within 150' of boats, shore, swimmers, and paddle craft. w Observe waterway markers.
- Personal watercraft (PWC) may operate between sunrise and sunset
- Lifejackets required for children 12 and under
- One lifejacket for each passenger on board
- Lifejackets are required for all PWC riders

Sand Mountain

Off-highway vehicle riding is allowed on the south and east sides of the reservoir. Sand Mountain, which is accessed by a tunnel located south of the OHV staging area, offers 20,000 acres of prime OHV riding.

Wildlife

Many species call Sand Hollow home including, coyotes, foxes, rabbits, a variety of desert snakes, scorpions, lizards, and bugs. Be aware. In the heat of summer, the sand on the beaches can heat up to 100 degrees. Be cautious of your children and your pets.

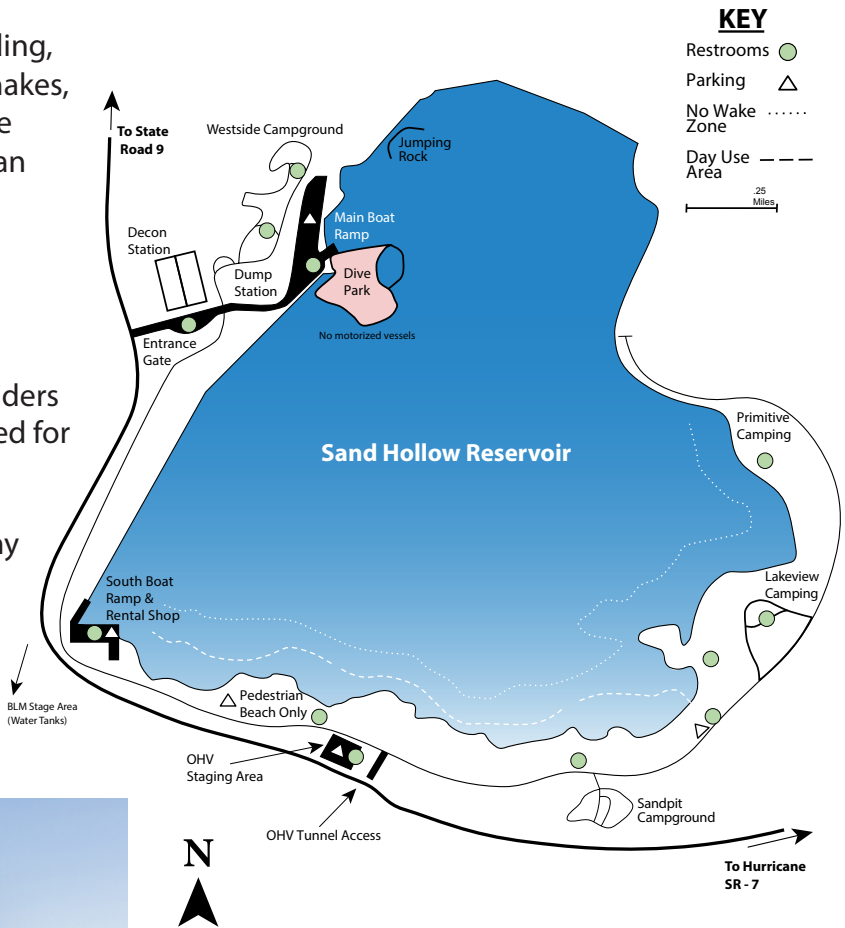
Are You Ready To Ride?

- D.O.T. approved helmets are required for riders under age 18 and are strongly recommended for all riders.
- Whip flags are required on all OHVs and any registered vehicle driving off-road.
- All machines must be currently registered.



Utah law allows anyone under 18 years of age to operate an OHV if they possess either a valid driver's license or an approved education certificate, under direct adult supervision, and able to reach and operate each control necessary to operate the off-highway vehicle.
