



# Berm

**Trail Access:** Berm Trailhead

**Allowable Uses:** Hike, Bike, Equestrian

**Distance:** 2 miles (round trip)

**Difficulty:** Easy

**Hiking Time:** 1 hour



## Trail Description

From the Berm Trailhead (accessible from 100 E in Ivins), keep right to follow the trail along the top of the dike, enjoying views of sandstone mesas to the left and the city of Ivins to the right. Keep following the trail east—after about one mile, you will come upon a fork that branches to the right. This is where the Berm Trail converges with the Toe Trail. To continue on the Berm Trail, continue past this trail on the right and keep straight to head east towards Tuacahn Drive. The Berm Trail ends at Tuacahn Drive where it connects with a paved trail.

## Special Features

The Berm trailhead begins with a fork in the trail—keep right to follow the top of the dike or left to follow the maintenance road into the valley between the dike and the cliffs. Hikers can choose either of these paths, but must stay on the trail they choose during the hike. The top route is level and features a compact, crushed rock surface.

## Safety and Considerations

Minimal shade may result in prolonged sun exposure. Wear appropriate footwear and clothing, and bring water.

## Park Rules

- All visitors are required to stay on mapped trails.
- Dogs must be leashed. Scoop and dispose all waste.
- Day use hours are 6am-10pm.
- Pack out all litter.
