Trail Access: Toe Trailhead

Allowable Uses: Hike, Bike, Equestrian

Distance: 2.2 miles (round trip)

Difficulty: Easy

Hiking Time: 1 hour



Trail Description

At the Toe Trailhead (adjacent to Snow Canyon Drive), head west on the dirt path that lies on the northern edge of the neighborhood. The trail consists of level and evenly packed dirt as it curves between creosote bushes and other vegetation, with views of sandstone mesas on the right. After passing a bend that leads in a southwest direction, the trail becomes slightly more sandy. You may notice a few off-shoot trails branching towards the houses on the left—these are access points to nearby neighborhoods. Pass these off-shoots and continue west on the main trail. After crossing a wash, you'll walk among very small, rolling mounds as you approach Tuacahn Drive. Head west to cross the street, rejoining the dirt trail on the other side as it leads you northwest towards the sandstone cliffs. The Toe Trail ends when it meets the Berm Trail.

Special Features

A family friendly stroll through sand sage and creosote habitat with views of Red Mountain. This is excellent wildlife habitat. Be alert; slow your speed; and share the trail with other user and wildlife. Protect sensitive habitat by staying to the mapped trail.

Safety and Considerations

Minimal shade may result in prolonged sun exposure. Wear appropriate clothing, and bring water.

Park Rules

- All visitors are required to stay on mapped trails.
- Dogs must be leashed. Scoop and dispose all waste.
- Day use hours are 6am-10pm.
- Pack out all litter.
