**The First Pony Express Ride** – (HJEC) pg 6, (ITS) pg 119. “On April 7, 1860 there was more excitement in Camp Floyd. People were gathered on the old fort wall and other buildings looking westward. Presently a shout went up, for in the distance was a dark object which rapidly grew and took shape. It was a horseman riding on the run. In his saddle were two pouches. The first mail from California by Pony Express. At the fort a fresh horse was waiting. The mail was transferred and the rider quickly disappeared in the direction of Salt Lake City. A few hours later a rider passed through, going to Sacramento. Presently the passing through of the Pony Express became a common occurrence.”

“Grandfather William B. Thomas was the first Pony Express rider out of Fairfield. I think one of the Carson’s delivered the mail to him from the north. Grandfather lived then just across the road from the station.” (Note: While William B. Thomas is listed as a Pony Express Rider, the writer was mistaken about Carson. There is no mention of a Carson having been a Pony Express Rider.)
