Batty in Snow Canyon

The park is home to 16 different species of bats who roost in our cliffs and lava tubes. During the winter, many species will migrate south to warmer weather. The Townsend's big-eared bat overwinters here in Snow Canyon! They will hibernate in our lava tubes and emerge again in the spring. Please give all wildlife space and let the bats nap the cold months away peacefully. Learn more on our *Batty and Beauty* program!

Lava Tubes

On the Lava Flow trail, there are two lava tubes accessible to the public. These are wonderful scrambling areas for visitors of all ages.

However, glowsticks and spray paint negatively impacts the tubes and other visitor's experience. *Use of glowsticks, spray paint, fireworks, etc. is vandalism (and illegal)!* Protect your access, and report vandalism to park rangers.

Urban Night Sky Place

Snow DarkSky International has certified Snow Canyon State Park as an Urban Night Sky Place, marking the 10th Utah State Park location recognized for their conservation of night skies.
